\$5 for a neutered or spayed dog until March 31.

\$10 for a fertile dog until March 31. Fees go up \$5.00 after March 31. Proof of current rabies vaccination required.

## All cats are required to have a lifetime license.



All animals not licensed or which do not exhibit the required metal identification tag are declared to be public nuisances, and it shall be the duty of the town to issue a citation to the owner.

## Please pick up after your dog!

Ordinance 331 Section 26:

Every person who owns or who has under his control or care any animal shall be responsible for picking up and immediately removing any offal or manure left by any such animal upon any public place or private property not owned by him or her.
